


ONLY 48% OF YOUTH LIVING WITH HIV IN THE U.S. ARE VIRALLY SUPPRESSED


The lowest percentage among all age groups.

BLACK YOUTH ARE DISPROPORTIONATELY AFFECTED BY THE HIV EPIDEMIC.

Only 32% of Louisiana's population is Black...

BUT 88% of new HIV infections among youth are Black

HOW ARE YOUNG PEOPLE ACQUIRING HIV? 18% are infected from heterosexual sex 79% are gay, bisexual men, and transwomen who have sex with men


36% of new HIV diagnoses among TRANSGENDER WOMEN in Louisiana were TRANS YOUTH

Only 52% of Louisiana youth living with HIV are virally suppressed

For young people living with HIV:

Achieving viral suppression is very important in order to lead a long, healthy life with HIV.

Also, being virally suppressed significantly reduces the chance of transmitting the virus to others.
