National HIV Testing Day is dedicated to encouraging people to find out their HIV status and helping those who are positive access treatment and reduce their risk of transmitting HIV to others.

There are an estimated 1.2 million people living with HIV in the U.S.



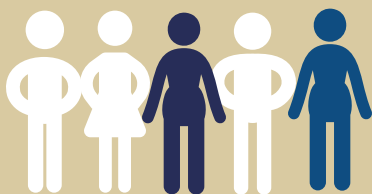
In 2019, an estimated 13% of people living with HIV were undiagnosed.



Check your status. Get tested for HIV.

Persons diagnosed early and engaged in HIV treatment can live long and healthy lives with HIV.

1 in 5 new HIV diagnoses in the U.S. occur in young people 13-24 years-old.



66% of persons living with HIV in the U.S. are virally suppressed.





Viral suppression is when a person has very low levels of HIV in their blood. People who are virally suppressed cannot pass HIV on to sex partners.

Who should get tested for HIV?

Everyone between 13 to 64 years old should be tested for HIV at least once. If you are pregnant or planning to become pregnant, get tested as early as possible. Just check!

Get tested for HIV at least once a year if you:

-  Have had sex with a person living with HIV
-  Are a sexually active gay or bisexual man



Share needles to inject drugs



Are a sexually active transgender woman



Have been diagnosed or treated for another sexually transmitted infection

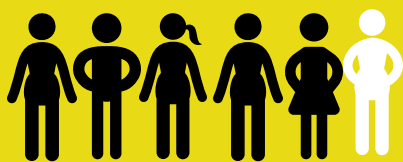

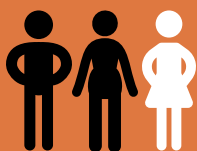
