Well-Ahead Louisiana and Louisiana Department of Health STD/HIV/Hepatitis Program's (SHHP) Hep C Elimination ECHO is a monthly virtual learning series to increase the number of hepatitis C virus (HCV) providers through training and collaboration in urban and rural communities. The learning model includes a combination of testing and treatment options used to target Louisianans with probable or confirmed cases of hepatitis C.

By joining, providers can acquire new skills and competencies, create best practices, and expand access to HCV treatment in underserved, untreated, unhoused and incarcerated populations in a bi-directional "all-teach, all-learn" environment.

- RHC and FQHC providers in rural areas are especially encouraged to join!

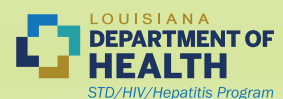
WHY SHOULD YOU JOIN?
